Subject: Providing these services? Complete training by Nov. 30 or claims will not

pay

Idaho Behavioral Health Plan providers who offer Respite or Skills Training and Development (STAD) care must complete mandatory one-time training(s) by November 30, 2024, or claims will not pay.

- Trainings are now posted on the <u>Magellan of Idaho website</u>, *On-Demand Training* page. Providers will have until November 30, 2024, to complete the training.
- During the month of October and November, providers can still offer Respite or STAD care *prior* to taking the required training(s).
- Providers who have not completed the training(s) by Nov. 30, 2024, will not be eligible for payment of Respite or STAD claims on/after Dec. 1, 2024.
- Providers who have previously taken the Respite or STAD training do not need to take this training.

Complete the self-paced online training(s) by Nov. 30, 2024.

About Respite

Respite services are short-term, temporary direct care and supervision services for youth with serious emotional disturbance (SED) intended to relieve a stressful situation, de-escalate a potential crisis situation, or provide a therapeutic outlet for a youth's emotional problems. About Skills Training and Development (STAD)
