

From: Magellan Healthcare **Subject:** Prepare for Targeted Care Coordination changes by Dec. 31

Targeted Care Coordination update

As Magellan previously communicated, the Targeted Care Coordination (TCC) program will end on Dec. 31, 2024. Agencies offering TCC will no longer be able to bill for this service.

Targeted Care Coordinators currently working with youth eligible through the 1915(i) State Plan Option (Medicaid YES Program) to complete Person-Centered Service Plans (PCSPs) can continue to work with youth and their PCSPs but must bill under the Case Management **(T1017)** billing code. Targeted Care Coordinators can also accept NEW clients to support going forward and must also bill under the Case Management billing code.

In addition, Community Based Case Managers, trained to complete PCSPs, can work with eligible youth through the 1915(i) State Plan Option (Medicaid YES Program) to develop PCSPs for both new and existing clients. Case Managers may complete PCSPs for clients **also receiving respite services at the same agency, if the agency has obtained a CMS exemption that they are the only willing and able provider for both services**. This is the same requirements for Wraparound providers.
