Subject: PCSP Training Required for 1915(i) Youth Effective May 11

Overview

Magellan has received many thoughtful questions following our recent communication regarding Person-Centered Service Plans (PCSPs) and the launch of the on demand training. We appreciate providers' engagement and partnership and are sharing this communication to clarify training requirements, timelines, and expectations.

On-demand PCSP training (required)

PCSP training is now available on demand and must be completed in order to develop or update PCSPs.

 - New users will be prompted to register using the security keyword **Idaho Training**.
 - Providers who are already registered in Magellan's learning management system will be routed directly to the training.

Timeline

Beginning May 11, 2026, providers are responsible for developing and/or participating in the development of PCSPs for the 1915(i) ("Medicaid YES Program") youth they serve.

PCSP purpose and relationship to services

- The PCSP is a person-centered, coordinated care plan developed with the youth, family and involved providers.
- The PCSP is not used by Magellan to authorize or deny services or claims.
 - Services do not need to be included on a PCSP to be delivered.
- PCSPs are completed at least annually and updated as needs, goals, or services change.
- A needed or overdue PCSP is not a reason to delay, deny or discontinue services. Medicaid-eligible youth remain eligible for covered services.

Roles and responsibilities

- Licensed providers and supervised paraprofessionals may develop and update PCSPs after completing the required training.
- Providers collaborate with the youth, family, and informal supports to maintain the PCSP.
 - Other plans do not replace PCSPs, and PCSPs do not replace other required plans. For example, CBRS treatment plans are still required.

- If no involved provider is able to develop a PCSP, referrals for community case management support are appropriate.

Child and Family Team meetings

Child and Family Team (CFT) meetings are a key component of coordinated care and the mechanism through which PCSPs are developed and updated.
